It is the cold and flu season and the best protection from both is a strong immune system, built up through good nutrition and exercise.

The viruses that cause both colds and the flu (influenza) are not the same although the viruses are both present in the air we breathe and on things we touch. The influenza virus is potentially more deadly and around 100 people a





year in New Zealand die from influenza. As the influenza virus develops new strains each year the vaccine is updated annually and, contrary to some beliefs, the vaccine cannot give you influenza. The flu vaccine can also not prevent a common cold.

Things to look out for; as the cold and flu viruses invade the nasal passages, symptoms for both are sore throats, headaches and stuffy noses. The stronger your immune

system is to start off with the better your defences. A bout of influenza will normally

come on quite suddenly and symptoms include fever, aching muscles, tiredness and a dry cough and an upset stomach. Older people, young children, pregnant women, and people with certain medical conditions are at a higher risk of developing serious complications from influenza, such as pneumonia. If any of your family have any of the above conditions, they may be eligible for a free vaccination.

What to do; if your child has a fever and not eating, keep them home from school. Plenty of rest, lots of fluids and paracetamol for any headaches. Ensure you and your family don't spread the infection by washing your hands frequently and using tissues for coughs and sneezes. Te Ngae Medical Centre advise you to consider protecting yourself and your family by having everyone immunised and advise you talk to your GP, you may also visit the Ministry of Health website:

Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ

I take this opportunity to present to you Who is My Neighbour? - The Hamilton Diocesan Strategic Plan 2014-2015.

The title, **Who is My Neighbour?**, has obvious roots in sacred scripture, Luke 10:29. This is also the inspiration for Pope Francis' Message to mark the 48th World Day of Social Communications, on 1 June 2014. This Message, while addressing the topic of social communications, is prophetic and powerful. I believe that it has much to say to the Hamilton Diocese as we look strategically at planning for *today* and for the *future*.

THE ISSUES

It will come as no surprise to you that the number of priests in the Hamilton Diocese is falling and the age of the priests increasing. All the Dioceses in New Zealand, and many of those abroad, are facing these same realities. Many of the local Dioceses are presently investigating strategic ways by which they can address these important issues.

Unlike other New Zealand Dioceses, the Hamilton Diocese has made the deliberate decision not to invite seminarians from other countries and from vastly different cultural backgrounds to our own, to complete their training for the priesthood here. The Hamilton Diocese has also decided to maintain a balance in its presbyterate between the number of New Zealand priests and the number of those from overseas. These decisions mean that our Diocese has to look at a radical rethinking of the ways in which we offer spiritual and pastoral care to our people, and to look at smarter and more efficient ways in which we deploy our priests and deacons.

THE HAMILTON DIOCESE STRATEGIC PLANNING COMMITTEE

In December 2013, I appointed Monsignor Trevor Murray and Fr Darren McFarlane as the coordinators of the Hamilton Diocesan Strategic Planning Committee. Since then, I have also invited Carole Fleming, the chairperson of the Diocesan Pastoral Council, to join them.

Since its appointment, the Committee has reviewed the past proposals and initiatives of successive Priests' Councils, various committees, different groups and individuals from all parts of the Diocese. The Strategic Planning Committee has taken these proposals, recommendations and suggestions, and prepared *Who is My Neighbour?* – The Hamilton Diocesan Strategic Plan 2014–2015, for consideration by myself and the Priests' Council, which we approved in principle at our meeting of 11 February 2014. **A FRESH APPROACH**

There are five features of Who is My Neighbour? which I wish to highlight:

- 1. its focus on the teaching of Pope Francis, especially his strong call for a return to the Spirit of Vatican II;
- 2. the disestablishment of the three Deaneries and the establishment of nine new Collegial Areas;
- 3. the merging of neighbouring parishes into one parish seeing a decrease from 36 parishes to 17 parishes;
- the deployment of personnel so that all but one of the new Collegial Areas can provide, from within its own number, for priests' holidays, as well as supply in the case of absences, sicknesses or other unforeseen circumstances;
- 5. its emphasis on strategic planning for *today* as well as tomorrow.

TIMELINE

- A tight, but achievable, timeline has been set for the implementation of Who is My Neighbour?:
- by 31 December 2014 for all Collegial Areas
- This timeline has been made possible because:
- · certain decisions have been taken at the diocesan level;
- Who is My Neighbour? builds on the tremendous work that had already taken place in the Hamilton Diocese almost since its establishment in 1980.

This timeline envisages:

- · presentations to the priests;
- a presentation to the Diocesan Pastoral Council;
- presentations to parish and school leadership;
- further consultation and discussions at the level of the Collegial Area and Parish.

A WORD FROM POPE FRANCIS

Pope Francis, while speaking to us about social communications, makes some powerful and compelling arguments for the Hamilton Diocese at this crucial crossroads in our history:

"It is not enough to be passers-by on the digital highways, simply 'connected'; connections need to grow into true encounters. We cannot live apart, closed in on ourselves. We need to love and to be loved. We need tenderness. Media strategies do not ensure beauty, goodness and truth in communication. The world of media also has to be concerned with humanity, it too is called to show tenderness. The digital world can be an environment rich in humanity; a network not of wires but of people."

My hope is that **Who Is My neighbour?** – The Hamilton Diocesan Strategic Plan 2014–2015 becomes not another network of words, but of people.

Let us invoke the power of the Holy Spirit and the intercession of Saint Peter Chanel as we embark on this exciting journey in the life of our Diocese.

Dear Parishioners

These words from our Bishop that you have just read may be surprising for you, or challenging, or even worrying. It's important for us to appreciate that, of all people in the Diocese, we are the most prepared for the changes that Bishop announces to us. For the past six years our parishes here in Rotorua have been slowly but steadily moving to this point:

- X We have a coordinated Mass timetable which enables people to choose the Mass time which best suits them
- X We have one Parish Pastoral Council
- X We have one Finance Committee
- X We are now exploring the possibility of merging our parish accounts
- X We have one office and one presbytery
- X Many of us-especially the weekday Mass goers-are comfortable moving between churches

The process that Bishop Denis outlines is the logical "next step" for us, and will see little change in the way parish life operates from day-to-day.

On May 14th, representatives of our parish staff, Parish Council, Finance Committee, and our schools will travel to Taupo for a meeting with representatives from Taupo and Turangi parishes, to work towards our becoming a Collegial Area. I ask you to pray for them.

And let us pray for each other. May Jesus' frequent words to the disciples be the words we hear at this time in the life of the Church in Rotorua: **"Be not afraid!"**
