#### NZQA FEES - FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The purpose of financial assistance is to ensure that fees are not a barrier to participation in qualifications for students in low-to-middle income families. Each year the government provides limited funding for eligible students enrolled in New Zealand secondary schools who are entering for assessment against standards on the New Zealand Qualifications Framework (NZQF) and for New Zealand Scholarship.

International students are not eligible for financial assistance.

To be eligible for financial assistance, the applicant (normally the parent or guardian of the candidate) must be the feepayer and must apply under one of the following application types:

- Benefit applications this includes those receiving a Work and Income or Study Link benefit
- Income-based applications this includes those that have a joint family[1] income that would entitle the applicant to receive a Community Services Card
- Multiple candidate applications this includes fee-payers with two or more children who are candidates where the total fees to pay would otherwise be more than the \$200 multiple candidate maximum.

#### The Laramie Project

The Laramie Project is a critical piece of theatre highlighting the faults in our culture. The John Paul College Senior Drama class has taken this project on with sincerity and commitment. The Laramie Project is a documentary-style play written by Moisés Kaufmann in 2000 that analyses the death of Matthew Shepard.

Although the themes are adult, society as a whole would benefit from seeing this well written play. The play draws on hundreds of interviews conducted by the theatre company with inhabitants of the town, company members' own journal entries, and published news reports.

Mathew's murder has become a rallying cry by those who embrace so-called "hate crimes" legislation. In October 2009, the United States Congress passed the Matthew Shepard and James Byrd Jnr. Hate Crimes Prevention Act (commonly known as the "Matthew Shepard Act")

On 28 October 2009, President Obama signed the legislation into law.

The Laramie Project is the chronicle of the life of the town of Laramie, Wyoming a year after the murder of Matthew Shepard.





#### **BACKGROUND**

The OCYP is supported by the Rotorua Community Youth Centre Trust, Te Waiariki Purea Trust, Rotorua Mayor Steve Chadwick, Rotorua MP Todd McClay and facilitated by Alan Solomon.

They students every Wednesday of term two to organise a Youth Development programme.

The students participating in the programme have been handpicked by their teachers as they have been identified as having the potential to be great future leaders. They are all motivated and inspiring in their own right.

Throughout the duration of the course, they will learn skills that they will be able to take with them and use for the rest of their lives; leadership, time management, communication, team building, public speaking and much more. At the end of the course they will also gain a Level 3, 12 credit unit in Certificate in Youth Leadership.

#### **ONECHANCE YOUTH CONCERT**

Due to the success of the inaugural 'OneChance Youth Seminar' in 2013, this year the students will be organising and running the 'OneChance Youth Concert'.

The objective of the concert is to inspire and motivate youth to achieve their goals and dreams and will show case talented young NZ musicians, bands and solo acts.

There will also be motivational guest speakers, interactive dance, art and performance workshops, entertainment, loads of prizes and stalls.

The OCYP students will also be fundraising for CanTeen, helping kids with cancer.

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
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
