# **SCHOOL FEES & ATTENDANCE DUES**

The Hamilton Diocese have spent well over \$10million on buildings for JPC over the last decade. A new technology block, costing \$3.3million will be ready for use at the start of term one 2015.

NCEA Guide includes key content about the structure of NCEA, how the qualification is used after studying, how credits work, and how endorsements are earned. Users can also choose to view the content in English or Te Reo.

Importantly, parents and whānau can also get information about how they can support family members studying towards gaining their secondary school qualification.

For employers, content focusses on what they can expect to see when job candidates show them documents detailing their qualifications and what they have studied.

My name is Lyn Whelan and I write in my capacity as the New Zealand Society of Genealogists (NZSG) appointed Child and Youth Education Co-ordinator to seek your assistance. To coincide with recent Anzac Day commemorations, the NZSG launched a long running competition for all students attending New Zealand schools, to commemorate service during the war years. The competition will close on 11 November (Armistice Day) 2014.

I am contacting schools, public libraries, community youth groups and organisations, historical societies, and teaching organisations nationwide in the hope that you can facilitate student awareness around your region of this competition. Students will have an opportunity to explore genealogy, family history and New Zealand's bi-cultural heritage, beyond the formal classroom environment by way of poster or written submission.

There are two sections in the competition - one for primary aged students in years 1 to 8, and a second section for secondary students in years 9 to 13. Entrants are asked to prepare either a poster or a written account of the story of an ancestor, relative or someone known to them (of either gender) who served in any branch of the forces of any country, at home or overseas.
