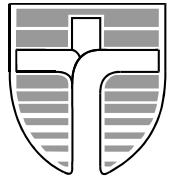

PART-TIME WORK EXCESSIVE

The New Zealand Council for Educational Research has clearly indicated that students in the senior school should be putting in 2-3 study hours per night and 4-5 hours in the weekend. A significant number of senior students are working so many hours in a part-time capacity that it compromises their ability to do well in NCEA. I would be grateful if you could speak to your children about their part-time work and at this critical time of the year, cut back if necessary.

AT RISK STUDENTS NOT COMPLETING NCEA LEVELS 1 & 2

Mr Sinclair and Faculty Heads will be identifying students at risk of having insufficient credits for Levels 1 & 2. These students will be required to return to school after seniors leave, to work with teachers in order to gain sufficient credits to pass Levels 1 & 2.

If your child is in this cohort of students, you will receive a letter in Term 4. Please support the college to help your child achieve academic success in order to gain qualification.

- **SOMETHING FOR SCHOOL**

Exercise book, pencil case, pens, pencils, colouring pencils, sharpener, eraser, chalk, etc.

- **SOMETHING TO WEAR**

T-shirt, shorts, underwear, cap, beanie, sandals, thongs, etc.

- **SOMETHING TO PLAY WITH**

(We usually receive most gifts for the middle age bracket and more girls' gifts than boys; 10-14yr old boy's boxes seem to be particularly hard to fill).

Please do not send in food or lollies of any; old or damaged items; anything that might break e.g. mirror; anything that can cause harm or relates to war; anything that relates to gambling such as playing cards and dice.

- **MONEY TO COVER TRANSPORT AND DELIVERY**

Although the boxes are delivered by volunteers there are many expenses incurred it costs \$9 per box so all donations of money are equally important.



As with every year, you may also take home and fill a box as a family if you prefer.

I am always humbled by the generosity of the staff, students and their families each year in creating these shoeboxes of love. All donations should be brought directly to RSC2 please.

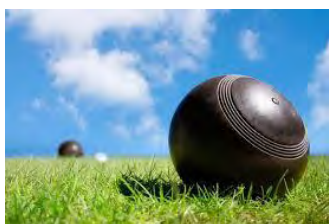
JPC Football 1st XI Girls Central Bay Champions
