It records the names of students, dating back to 2005 who have achieved an NCEA Scholarship, which puts them in the top 3% of academic students in the country or top 1% for an outstanding scholarship. JPC C team uniforms (playing shirts and socks) and the playing shirts from the JPC B team need to be returned to Ms Northey this week please.


There are **still outstanding fees** required from some parents; unless an arrangement has been made with the Accounts Office.


