
Please be considerate to our neighbours, pedestrian students and the buses during peak times by not causing congestion.

# **ATTENTION!** Parents/Whanau

As at the 10<sup>th</sup> February 2014 there have been 14 confirmed cases of **measles** in the Taupo and Turangi areas associated with (exposure of the first cases) at a hip-hop dance competition in December in Sydney. Two cases required a brief period of hospitalisation. All these cases are in two extended family groups who have links with the event in Sydney.

One other case of measles has been confirmed in the Bay of Plenty and was the result of exposure to **measles** on a flight from Singapore to Auckland on the 12<sup>th</sup> January.

<u>Measles is a notifiable disease</u>. Hence we are asking all parents of John Paul College students if your child has not been immunised please email the school nurse : <u>nurse@jpc.school.nz</u> and let her know that this is the case so we can help protect your child and others at John Paul College. All information will be kept confidential.

# QUARANTINE ADVICE FOR NON-IMMUNE CONTACTS OF CASES

Non-immune contacts are required to be in quarantine for a period which is from <u>7 days after their first</u> possible exposure to <u>14 days after their last possible exposure</u>.

Acceptable evidence of immunity is any one of the following:

- Being 45 years old or older (born before 1 January 1969)
- Documented evidence of two MMR vaccinations given at least one month apart
- Serological evidence of immunity
- Previous confirmed measles infection.

# JPC SENIOR DEBATERS WIN WAIKATO REGIONAL DEBATING COMPETITION!

John Paul College Year 13 debaters **Fintan Walsh**, **Timothy Bradley** and **Eillish Satchell** won the 2014 Waikato Regional Championship of the Russell McVeagh Debating Competition hosted by the University of Waikato on Sunday, 02 March at the University of Waikato. It was a full day of prepared debate followed by several impromptu debates. The first three moots were (1) *This House would televise criminal trials*. (2) *This House would make Te Reo Maori a compulsory subject in schools* and (3) *This House would require graduates from New Zealand universities to stay in New Zealand*. John Paul College defeated St John's College, Hamilton in the semi-final negating the argument that *This House would ban cosmetic surgery* and defeated Hillcrest High School, Hamilton affirming the moot in the highly charged final that *This House believes that National should be re-elected*. John Paul College became the top debating school in the Waikato and Bay of Plenty. **Fintan Walsh** was awarded Best Speaker and was selected for the Waikato Regional team which will compete in the National Finals in Wellington. 
