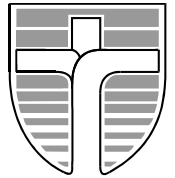

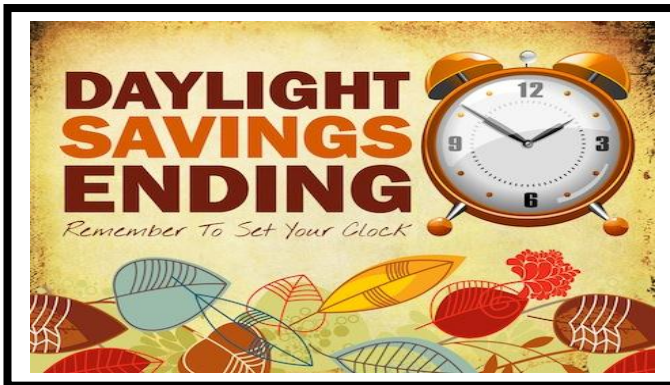

First time donors aged between 16yrs and 65 years

Fit and healthy

Weigh at least 50kg

Have waited 6 months after having a body piercing or tattoo

Are completely well after having a cold, cough, or flu (7 day stand down after finishing antibiotics)

If you have lived in the UK, Ireland or France between 1980 and 1996 for a cumulative period of 6 months or more you cannot donate blood due to mad cow outbreak in the 1980s.

It is important to have had food and fluids (water) before you donate

REMEMBER TO BRING YOUR I. D i.e. - blood donor card, drivers licence or school photo ID

It isn't every day you can do something to save someone's life but that's exactly what you do every time you donate blood.

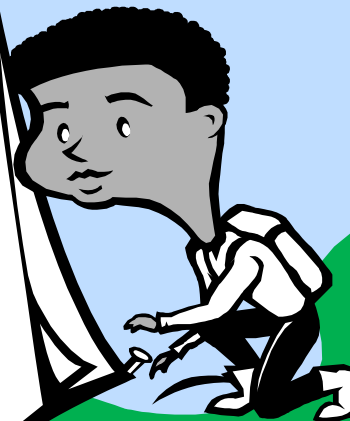


