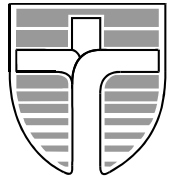

## **TERM 2 CRITICAL FOR SENIORS**

I will be impressing upon the senior school (Years 11-13) that Term 2, is a critical time to focus on assessments, attending all classes and ploughing through the syllabus.

Please support the college by:

-  Ensuring that they do a minimum of 2-3 hours of school work per night and 4-5 hours in the weekend;
-  Check they are not too distracted from school work by part-time employment, their social life or technology pastimes;
-  Checking their assessment schedule;
-  Liaising with their teachers if you have any concerns.

At this stage of the year, students in the senior school are receiving feedback on how many credits they have achieved and at what level. This will let them know if they are on target to achieve level 1, 2 or 3.

Please ask your children to share this information with you. They can also access the NZQA website to check on their progress. If you have any concerns contact their teachers. Senior exams commence Monday May 25<sup>th</sup>

## **MID YEAR EXAMS FOR YEAR 11-13: 25-29<sup>th</sup> MAY**

These exams will give students the real benefits of experiencing exam conditions. It helps them refocus on what they have learned, gain qualitative feedback from teachers and in many cases, gain valuable credits and complete assignments.

Please encourage your children to take them seriously, given the benefits and the fact they are compulsory.

## Happy Easter!

The Easter season begins on the evening of Easter Sunday and continues for fifty days, ending on the evening of Pentecost Sunday. The eight days following Easter are observed as the Octave of Easter and each day has the same solemnity as a Sunday. If another solemnity falls during the octave it is transferred to the following Monday.

The fifty days between Easter and Pentecost are a time of joy and thanksgiving for what Christ has done for humanity. The paschal candle is in a prominent place in the sanctuary of the church and is lit for all liturgical celebrations.

In New Zealand the Ascension is celebrated on the Seventh Sunday after Easter. The feast of the Ascension commemorates the ascension of Jesus into heaven after his resurrection.



One week after the Ascension, on the 50th day after Easter, the feast of Pentecost is celebrated. Pentecost commemorates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the apostles, which empowered them to go out and begin spreading the Gospel. On Pentecost Sunday we celebrate the founding of the Church (sometimes called "the birthday of the Church") and the beginning of its mission to all peoples.

The liturgical colour of most of the Easter season is white. The liturgical colour for Pentecost is red, which symbolises the Holy Spirit and the tongues of fire which appeared above the heads of the apostles when they received the Holy Spirit.

First time donors aged between 16yrs and 65 years

Fit and healthy

Weigh at least 50kg

Have waited 6 months after having a body piercing or tattoo

Are completely well after having a cold, cough, or flu (7 day stand down after finishing antibiotics)

If you have lived in the UK, Ireland or France between 1980 and 1996 for a cumulative period of 6 months or more you cannot donate blood due to mad cow outbreak in the 1980s.

**It is important to have had food and fluids (water) before you donate**

**REMEMBER TO BRING YOUR I. D** i.e. - blood donor card, drivers licence or school photo ID

## Why Do Catholics Make Different Signs Of The Cross?



Because they are personal gestures that assist a Christian sanctify daily life with symbols of Jesus' crucifixion. This was done in the early church by drawing a cross on the forehead with the right thumb. Later it was made by tracing a cross by drawing the right hand from head to breast to left shoulder to the right shoulder. ## Kia ora tātou. Warm greetings to you all from Nancy and Neil – Counsellors.

Now that the year is well underway it seems a good time to begin the first of what will be regular fortnightly contributions to the school newsletter from the Counselling team. Our hope is that this space will provide helpful information to parents and whanau about some of the work we do at school, as well as providing a link to resources you might find interesting and topical as you parent your children and teens. Each fortnight we will present some aspect of our work as counsellors at JPC and we welcome your feedback. Firstly, some introductions.

**Nancy Macmillan** (Ph extn 8854). Some of you may know me from my previous role as an English teacher here at JPC. In 2011 I embarked on study through the University of Waikato towards a Master of Counselling, completing this at the end of 2013. Since June 2014 I have been Head of Counselling at John Paul College. I am loving my new role which sees me working closely with students to support them in working through challenges they face in their lives. I welcome your input as parents and whanau in caring for and supporting our students.

**Neil Carter** (Ph extn 8808). I have an 18 year history as a community and faith based youth worker, running youth groups and teaching life skills programmes in schools. I have spent many years working with young people and their families, helping them deal with the issues life throws at them. Last year I completed a Diploma in Counselling from Bethlehem Tertiary Institute. I pride myself on being non-judgmental and easy to talk to. My goal is not to tell students what to think or believe, but to assist them in understanding themselves and supporting them as they journey through life.

### ***This week's focus is the Travellers Programme.***

**Travellers** is a school-based programme for young people in their first year of secondary school that helps them face life's challenges with confidence and new skills. Its aim is to help students build resilience and develop self-confidence. From an on-line survey, a group of 8 students will be invited to participate in a 10 week course of learning led by the two school counsellors. The permission of parents/caregivers will be sought prior to the start of the course.

Findings from the Travellers pilot project:

*Young people report:*

- *that their experience in Travellers enhanced their connections with peers, family members, staff and facilitators*
- *reduced emotional distress*
- *improved school performance*
