(*Year 7 and 8 are not included in this census)

"MORE & MORE STUDENTS WEAR SCHOOL SPORTS COLOURS"

Results from the 2014 NZSSSC School Sport Census shows a continuation of the trend of recent years, with 54% of students representing their school in sport in 2014, up 1% from the previous year. Garry Carnachan, Executive Director of NZSSSC said that "While 1% seems a small increment, it actually represents more than 3000 extra students representing their school in sport since the previous year, and, since 2010 when the declining trend was reversed, the 3% increase equates to almost 10,000 additional students pulling on their school colours."

Perhaps surprising, but a particularly pleasing outcome in 2014, was that for the first time since 2000, the numbers of teachers supporting school sport through coaching, managing or officiating increased. After more than 15 years in slow decline, 35% of teachers provided leadership for school sport last year, up 2% on the 2013 figure. Mr Carnachan said "We know student participation is closely linked to teacher support so to see more teachers involved is very encouraging. With international research and the results of the SportNZ Sport in Education project showing a strong connection between sporting participation and improved student achievement and engagement in school, including attendance and behaviour, it is exciting to perhaps see more teachers now recognising the benefits of getting involved with their students in school sport."

The traditional sports continue to be strong in schools with Netball and Rugby each attracting around 30,000 students and remaining stable in terms of numbers over recent years. Football, Basketball, Volleyball, Touch, Hockey, Athletics, Badminton and Cricket round out the top 10 in terms of numbers of students involved. "The traditional school sports remain very important to schools and students", said Mr Carnachan, "however the changing nature of sport with so many choices now available to young people is reflected by sports such as Adventure Racing, Futsal, Mountain Biking and Orienteering all showing growth of more than 20% over the last 5 years".

JPC SPORTS PARTICIPANT CENSUS 2014

End of each year a Census is done for Years 9-13 only. All secondary schools nationwide are required to complete a census. The information is then tabulated onto a national database. Information is collated by Sports Code.

By the numbers: 55% of school roll is involved in some form of sport at JPC. JPC male students involved in sport dropped to 57%, compared to 63% in 2013. Girls had a slight increase of 1%.

Teachers involve in sport, NZ average 35%, BOP average 31%, JPC 23%.

Please Note: Teachers at JPC also look after Year 7 & 8 level sports, compared to other secondary schools.

Nationally Netball is the number 1 sport in NZ schools, followed by Rugby (2nd), Basketball (3rd) Football (4th), Volleyball (5th), Hockey (6th), and Touch (7th).

This year we have more teachers involved in sport, especially the major codes.

Code of Conduct for Sports at John Paul College.

As a supporter on the side line, your behaviour has a special role in the development of your child and their team mates. Your encouragement will do more to ensure good self-discipline than any other influence.

While winning is important, playing hard, playing fair and having FUN is the essence of any game.

Support your child

By giving encouragement and showing interest in the team.

Always be positive

Applaud good plays from both teams, only one team can win the game but both teams can enjoy the game without criticism from the sideline.

Please remember you are not the coach or the referee

Parents who articulate comments from the sideline often give inappropriate advice at the wrong time.

If there is any sideline instructions these need to be given by the coach only.

Remain well back from the sidelines and within the spectator area.

What you say before, during and after the game matters, keep positive and neutral.

Demonstrate a positive attitude towards your opponents and their supporters.

Make them feel welcomed, when it's a home game.

Opponents are not the enemy.

Remember your child plays sport to have fun.

It is your child playing, not you. Your child must establish their own goals- to play the game for themselves. They also need to learn to stand on their own two feet and build resilience in their own way.

As a coach, manager, parent or caregiver,

I realize this is a school sport and not the Olympic Games.

My job on the sideline is to represent my child and John Paul College in a manner that demonstrates fair play and good character.

I know I must not be abusive towards, the opposition, the referees or any officials.

I also accept that the coaches make decisions they need to, for the good of the team.

I will refrain from yelling out instructions from the side line.

If I have an issue with any decisions regarding my child I will contact the staff in charge of the sporting code at John Paul College and not question the coach on the sideline before, during and after the game.

I trust that the staff in charge of the sporting code will deal with any reasonable issue I have in an appropriate manner.

I agree that once my child has committed to a sport they will not withdraw after teams have been named and leave the team in a difficult situation. I will endeavor to have them at trainings and games.

I will help other parents remember these rules as sometimes in the heat of the moment we do forget.

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
