Dear Parents/ Caregivers Kia Ora, Malo e Lelei, Talofa, Greetings.

SICKBAY BUDGET

It has come to my attention that many students are attending the Sick Bay to request anti-histamine, asthma, headache (Panadol) and sore throat medications on a regular basis. If your child is prone to hayfever and/or asthma or presenting with flu symptoms can you please provide medications to the school nurse, Mrs Flavell, who will write the child's name on the packet and hold in storage for 'your' child. We provide medication on the first visit to the sick bay to enable the child to finish the school day but would appreciate home supplied medication for subsequent visits. Alternatively, if your child is sick and requiring constant medication please keep your child home to avoid infecting other students.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS/ STUDENTS

The following information is with regard to Text / Facebook Bullying and Harassment.

Text / Facebook bullying can take a number of forms:

- Mean or offensive messages received once or repeatedly
- Being bombarded by a large volume of messages
- Offensive or upsetting video or photo messages
- Threatening messages
- Persistent unwanted messages

Strategies if you get unwanted messages

- Do not reply. The sender may get bored and stop sending them
- If you do reply and want to make a complaint the telephone company may delay the process
- It is important to keep the unwanted messages on your phone and the number the messages were sent from. The date and time of the message is also important
- Talk to someone you trust, such as your parent/ caregiver, teacher or guidance counsellor at school or you can call 0508 NETSAFE 0508 638 723. It is important to talk to someone so they can provide you with support and help
- If you receive a message, which threatens to harm you or your property, you should keep the message saved on your phone and go to your local police station, 3499 595. If you feel you are in immediate danger, call 111 straight away

Who can you call about unwanted messages?

NetSafe 0508 NETSAFE (0508 638 723). If you are a Telecom customer, you can call them free if the bullying persists on 0800 809 806. The short cuts for the voice menu are 1, then 2, and then 0. Hours Mon-Fri 9.00a.m - 4.00p.m

If you are a Vodafone customer, you can phone them free on 777 from your mobile or on 0800 800 021 from landline. The call centre is available 7 days from 8a.m – 8p.m

Things you can do to prevent text / facebook bullying

- Be careful about who you give your number to. Never give out someone else's number without asking them first
- Don't reply to texts from people you don't know. In some cases, bullies send out random texts and wait to see who responds.
- Think about whether something you are sending might make another person feel uncomfortable. It might be a joke to you but not for someone else. If it does not feel right for you do not send it.
- Be careful about who you invite onto your Facebook contacts. Never give anyone else your Facebook password or the opportunity to access your Facebook
- A friendly reminder to John Paul College students, if you are sending any unwanted messages to anyone during school hours or after school hours, you are breaking the school rules i.e the Cyber Safety Agreement or ICT form you have signed to enter this school. Anyone who is sending text / facebook bullying messages or unwanted messages will have their phone confiscated and your parents/ caregiver will be notified. This includes if someone else uses your phone to send a text bullying message. If it is your phone it will be removed. Think carefully about who you are lending your phone to and what they are doing with it. The police will be informed and the telephone companies will also be notified of your actions. This can lead to your phone being blocked, as this is a criminal offence and you can be prosecuted. For any more information please check out the NetSafe web site www.netsafe.org.nz



NZQA FEES - FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The purpose of financial assistance is to ensure that fees are not a barrier to participation in qualifications for students in low-to-middle income families. Each year the government provides limited funding for eligible students enrolled in New Zealand secondary schools who are entering for assessment against standards on the New Zealand Qualifications Framework (NZQF) and for New Zealand Scholarship.

International students are not eligible for financial assistance.

To be eligible for financial assistance, the applicant (normally the parent or guardian of the candidate) must be the feepayer and must apply under one of the following application types:

- Benefit applications this includes those receiving a Work and Income or Study Link benefit
- Income-based applications this includes those that have a joint family[1] income that would entitle the applicant to receive a Community Services Card
- Multiple candidate applications this includes fee-payers with two or more children who are candidates where the total fees to pay would otherwise be more than the \$200 multiple candidate maximum.

Financial Assistance fees schedule 2015

Number of candidates fee-Fee-payer is eligible for beneficiary or Fee-payer is not eligible for beneficiary payer is paying for income-based assistance or income-based assistance

One child who is a candidate \$20.00 Full fees (\$76.70 for NZQF and 3 Scholarship subjects)

Two or more children who A maximum of \$30.00 per family A maximum of \$200.00 per fee-payer[2] are candidates

. The aim of the Women in Defence Experience is to provide a three day experience of the roles, expectations and lifestyle of our Officers, Sailors, Soldiers, Airmen and women of Defence, through quality training and information to motivated students who wish to pursue a career with the New Zealand Defence Force (NZDF).

The Women in Defence Experience is designed to challenge students through a wide variety of unfamiliar situations and team-building activities. Physical fitness activities will be conducted throughout the three days, with early morning exercises, confidence building, and social interaction with fellow students and Defence Force personnel.

The Women in Defence Experience will be conducted at the Tamaki Leadership Centre, WHANGAPARAOA, visiting RNZAF (Whenuapai) and HMNZS PHILOMEL (Devonport). The Experience will occur over the period 27 September - 30 September 2015 with 60 students chosen from around the country. The Experience will showcase selected trades of each of the services - Navy, Army and Air Force, and the lifestyle and work environment of a Serviceperson.


