NZQA FEES – FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The purpose of financial assistance is to ensure that fees are not a barrier to participation in qualifications for students in low-to-middle income families. Each year the government provides limited funding for eligible students enrolled in New Zealand secondary schools who are entering for assessment against standards on the New Zealand Qualifications Framework (NZQF) and for New Zealand Scholarship.

International students are not eligible for financial assistance.

To be eligible for financial assistance, the applicant (normally the parent or guardian of the candidate) must be the feepayer and must apply under one of the following application types:

- Benefit applications this includes those receiving a Work and Income or Study Link benefit
- **Income-based applications** this includes those that have a joint family[1] income that would entitle the applicant to receive a Community Services Card
- Multiple candidate applications this includes fee-payers with two or more children who are candidates where the total fees to pay would otherwise be more than the \$200 multiple candidate maximum.

KIA ORA TĀTOU FROM THE COUNSELLORS.

The term seems to be flying by and senior preliminary exams are almost upon us, starting next Wednesday (19th August). While most students are aware of the importance of these exams, for some, procrastination makes getting underway with exam preparation very difficult. The following information sourced from <u>www.cci.health.wa.gov.au</u> might be helpful in overcoming procrastination.

Procrastination is a common part of human behaviour. Often people mistake procrastination for "laziness". In everyday language people use definitions like, "putting off", "postponing", "delaying", "deferring", and "leaving to the last minute". While procrastination is quite common, it can become problematic if it is getting in the way of our goals and hopes for achievement and progress. Overcoming procrastination in practical ways involves knowing what needs to be done, how to do it and when to do it.

What Do I Need To Do?

• Write a 'To Do' list of tasks and goals you need to work on. This could be a list for the day, the week, the month, or longer, depending on what makes most sense for your circumstances;

• then prioritise the list of tasks, numbering them from most important to least important;

• then grade each task, that is, break the task into all the small steps or 'chunks' that are involved in achieving the task; and

• finally, accurately estimate how much time each step of each task or goal will take.

How Can I Do It?

Worst-First: knock out the worst task first, so all other tasks after that are easy by comparison.

Using Momentum: start doing a task that you like and that energises you, and then without a break quickly switch to a task that you have been putting off.

<u>Just 5-Minutes</u>: plan to spend just 5 minutes on the task. This is such a small amount of time, so you will feel you can tolerate just 5 minutes. At the end of the 5 minutes, reassess and see if you can spend just another 5 minutes on the task, and so on.

<u>Set Time Limits</u>: set a specific amount of time to work on a task (e.g., 30 minutes), and stick to just that, rather than extending things even if you feel you can.

<u>Prime Place</u>: be aware of what types of environments you get more done in, and what types of environments have distractions that make you more likely to procrastinate. Isolate yourself if necessary to minimise social and other distractions.

<u>Visualise</u>: use imagery to clearly visualise the task being successfully completed in your mind, and use the momentum from the visualisation to get going on the task in real life.

<u>Plan Rewards</u>: reward yourself after something has been achieved or as a well earned break from a task. The more you reward yourself for small achievements, the less you will feel like you are missing out or being deprived, hence you will procrastinate less.

When Can I Do It?

To manage your time availability, so that you know when you can do your tasks and goals, use a timetable to schedule your week.

Best wishes to all our senior students in side-stepping procrastination in their preparation for preliminary exams.

HANDS-ON OTAGO 2016 SUMMER SCHOOL – MAORI AND PASIFIKA SCHOLARSHIPS

The goal of Hands-On Otago is to demonstrate some of the activities that scientists are involved in and to encourage talented young New Zealanders to consider Science as a career. For the first time this year, this opportunity will be extended to students who wish to explore the possibilities in Humanities and Business, exposing them to current research and activities. Students can opt to experience any of the following subjects: Anatomy, Anthropology, Archaeology, Biochemistry, Chemistry, Computer Science, Education, Food Science, Genetics, Geography, Geology, History, Immunology, Information Science, Law, Marine Science, Marketing, Microbiology, Nanochemistry, Oceanography, Performing Arts, Pharmacology, Pharmacy and Philosophy, Physical Education, Physics, Physiology, Politics, Psychology, Tourism and Zoology.

Hands-On Otago will be held at the University of Otago, Dunedin, from 17 to 22 January 2016. It is the kind of opportunity normally only available to graduate students. To qualify for the programme, students must be entering Year 12 or Year 13 in 2016. Students must possess strong motivation and the potential to excel.

Applicants are required to write a page to support their application, which should include any information they feel is relevant and important. There are fully-funded scholarships available to Maori and Pasifika students.


The car seat cover fits in all cars the photos of it are in mum's territory and smaller sedan, the Nylon fabric does not rip and you just have to


The campaign works like this: Most of us have old mobile phones lying around at home somewhere. We ask that each family in our school come on board and donate any unwanted old mobile phones.
