

Although the boxes are delivered by volunteers there are many expenses incurred it costs \$9 per box so all donations of money are equally important.

As with every year, you may also take home and fill a box as a family if you prefer.

NZQA, SCHOLARSHIP & CAMBRIDGE FEES ARE DUE FOR PAYMENT AT THE ACCOUNTS OFFICE BY 21st AUGUST

NZQA FEES - FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The purpose of financial assistance is to ensure that fees are not a barrier to participation in qualifications for students in low-to-middle income families. Each year the government provides limited funding for eligible students enrolled in New Zealand secondary schools who are entering for assessment against standards on the New Zealand Qualifications Framework (NZQF) and for New Zealand Scholarship.

International students are not eligible for financial assistance.

To be eligible for financial assistance, the applicant (normally the parent or guardian of the candidate) must be the feepayer and must apply under one of the following application types:

- Benefit applications this includes those receiving a Work and Income or Study Link benefit
- Income-based applications this includes those that have a joint family[1] income that would entitle the applicant to receive a Community Services Card
- Multiple candidate applications this includes fee-payers with two or more children who are candidates where the total fees to pay would otherwise be more than the \$200 multiple candidate maximum.

Financial Assistance fees schedule 2015

Number of candidates feepayer is paying for

Fee-payer is eligible for beneficiary or Fee-payer is not eligible for beneficiary income-based assistance

or income-based assistance

One child who is a candidate \$20.00

Full fees (\$76.70 for NZQF and 3 Scholarship subjects)

Two or more children who are candidates

A maximum of \$30.00 per family

A maximum of \$200.00 per fee-payer[2]

Our apprentices are currently housed during their block courses at the Wintec Eco Village on the Rotokauri Campus. There may need to be alternative arrangements made depending on numbers in the future. No accommodation charges are incurred when in the village, however they will need to provide their own meals/food etc at their own cost.

This is a three year apprenticeship; successful candidates for the next intake will commence in the last week of January 2016.

The apprentices start with 10 weeks of study at Wintec in Hamilton then are placed "on the job" for approximately 10 weeks. They then return to Wintec for another 10 week block course before going out for on the job experience again.

Costs

Personal protective equipment (i.e. safety boots & glasses etc.) is provided with a basic toolkit. Their Wintec training fee is also paid for and all apprentices receive a scaled wage arrangement across the three year term of their apprenticeship.


