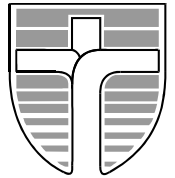

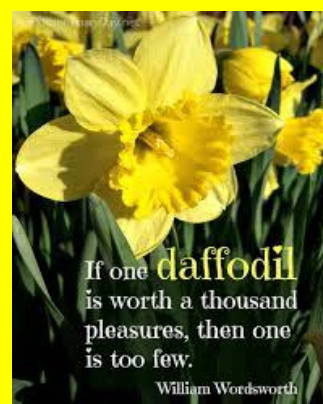

“Imagination is more important than knowledge” ~ Albert Einstein

Many people have wondered how Einstein’s brain worked...how was he able to think beyond what people knew to be true, in order to make new discoveries?

Falk agrees that both nature and nurture were probably involved, pointing out that Einstein's parents were "very nurturing" and encouraged him to be independent and creative..." (Falk's 2009 study)

The art student’s whose works feature here have certainly been strengthening the creative capabilities of their brains. Art fosters the development of “multiple types of intelligence” which Sir Ken Robinson (Author, educator and creativity expert) vigorously advocates.

These Level 1 Art students have been using symbolic objects and subject matter to explore their cultural identities. They also use imagery creatively to acknowledge the people in their lives who exercise virtues such as fortitude, temperance, prudence and justice.

Kia ora tātou from the Counsellors

As this winter term continues with its colder, rainy weather and all the accompanying winter bugs, we have noticed that students' resilience is a bit low. Coughs and colds, tiredness, work and exam pressures and friendship niggles all contribute to running down students' resilience in dealing with day to day speed bumps on life's busy road.

As adults it can be easy to step into rescue mode for our young people, and at times this is called for. Often though, helping children to reconnect with their own skills and resources in dealing with problems is more helpful for them in the long term.

Expressing our confidence in their ability to problem solve is empowering for children. It helps them to develop the confidence to be self-directing in their lives. Questions which redirect children's thinking to remembering times of overcoming similar problems can be helpful.

- What's worked for you in the past?
- How did you get past this problem last time?

Reminding them of attitudes we've seen evident in other contexts can also be brought to bear on new and different situations.

- I saw a lot of determination/ courage/ honesty/ etc. from you when you ... (past experience). How might you use that same determination/ courage/ honesty now?



Asking children "*What can you do about this?*" instead of "*What can I do about this?*" helps to grow children's confidence and self-belief and keeps them in the driver's seat of their own lives. Dr Seuss puts it well:

You have brains in your head, you have feet in your shoes, you can steer yourself any direction you choose.

This year John Paul College is hoping to put together 50 boxes and we are asking the students to bring in donations. Each student will gain 20 points for their school house for each item they donate. Please donate any of the following

- **SOMETHING TO LOVE**

Teddy bear, doll, soft toy, etc. (Please, no 'used' soft toys)

- **SOMETHING FOR SCHOOL**

Exercise book, pencil case, pens, pencils, colouring pencils, sharpener, eraser, chalk, etc.

- **SOMETHING TO WEAR**

T-shirt, shorts, underwear, cap, beanie, sandals, thongs, etc.

- **SOMETHING TO PLAY WITH**

Tennis ball, cars, skipping rope, marbles, musical instrument, yo-yo, slinky, finger puppets, wind up torch, etc.
(No battery operated items)*

- **SOMETHING FOR PERSONAL HYGIENE**

Soap and face washer, toothbrush, hairbrush, comb, hair-clips, scrunchies, etc. (No toothpaste, bubble bath or any other item that might leak)

- **SOMETHING SPECIAL**

Carry bag, sunglasses, bangles, necklaces, craft kits, stickers, note or photo of yourself.



The shoe boxes are packed for specific age and gender:

(We usually receive most gifts for the middle age bracket and more girls' gifts than boys; 10-14yr old boy's boxes seem to be particularly hard to fill).

Please do not send in food or lollies of any; old or damaged items; anything that might break e.g. mirror; anything that can cause harm or relates to war; anything that relates to gambling such as playing cards and dice.

- **MONEY TO COVER TRANSPORT AND DELIVERY**

Although the boxes are delivered by volunteers there are many expenses incurred it costs \$9 per box so all donations of money are equally important.



As with every year, you may also take home and fill a box as a family if you prefer.

I am always humbled by the generosity of the staff, students and their families each year in creating these shoeboxes of love. All donations should be brought directly to RSC2 please.

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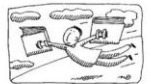
