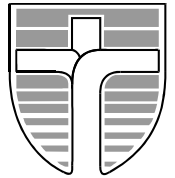

## BOARD OF TRUSTEES STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE

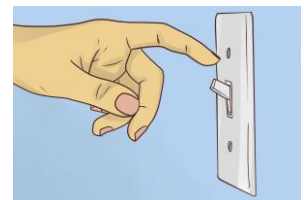

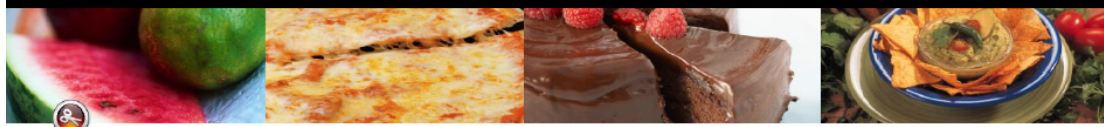

- **SOMETHING TO PLAY WITH**

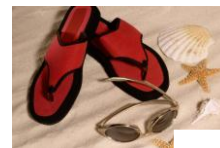
Tennis ball, cars, skipping rope, marbles, musical instrument, yo-yo, slinky, finger puppets, wind up torch, etc.

*Please do not send in food or lollies of any; old or damaged items; anything that might break e.g. mirror; anything that can cause harm or relates to war; anything that relates to gambling such as playing cards and dice.*

- **MONEY TO COVER TRANSPORT AND DELIVERY**

Although the boxes are delivered by volunteers there are many expenses incurred it costs \$9 per box so all donations of money are equally important.



As with every year, you may also take home and fill a box as a family if you prefer.

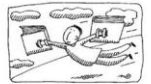
