#### JPC FOOTBALL - NATIONAL 1ST XI TOURNAMENT 2015

The 1st XI travelled to the NZ Secondary Schools National Football Tournament in Papamoa recently. JPC came into the tournament aiming for a top ten placing and they did not disappoint. Led by goal scoring Captain *Jack Tombleson*, JPC went through their 5 pool games unbeaten and quickly became the surprise package of the tournament. Unfortunately they lost a nail biting quarter final against Lynfield High School (Auckland) 1-2, after being one-nil ahead with 10 minutes to play. A penalty decision went against JPC and the opposition scored late to take out the game. With a top four spot lost, the team showed plenty of character to win their remaining two playoff games to secure a very satisfying 5th place finish which is the best result at a National 1st XI Tournament for a JPC Boys team for some years.

The outstanding team performance was built around a water tight defence that was superbly marshalled by outstanding goal keeper *Jacob Kitson*. They team conceded only 4 goals in the entire tournament and Kitson was named the tournament's "*Golden Glove*" winner for the least goals conceded. Right back *Tyson Rimme*r was in the heart of the defensive effort and was another player to impress coaches. *Jack Tombleson* was voted the teams "*MVP*" by the tournament organisers.

This JPC team is still very young with the majority of players in Year 11 and they have the potential to go even higher in future national tournaments.


