



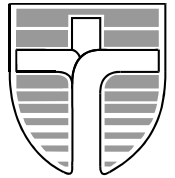

To select one Coach for Yr 7, Yr 8, Yr 10, Social & Senior Teams at John Paul College before March 2016 for the season ahead.

Selection Policy

The John Paul College Yr 7, Yr 8, Yr 10, Social & Senior Team coaches will comprise of coaches who are working towards Improving their coaching skills by attending Workshops held by Sport WBOP and Netball NZ. Workshop Fees will be paid by John Paul College with evidence of attendance.

Selection Procedure

John Paul College Netball will seek expressions of interest / applications via John Paul College Newsletter, website, Coach Contacts and Netball WBOP coach database by advertising.

- Coaches will apply via Email to JPC TIC of Netball for the desired age group.
- John Paul College TIC of Netball will acknowledge applications within 3 days of receipt.
- If there is only one suitable applicant for an age group, the John Paul College Netball TIC will have the final say in appointing the coach.
- The Interview Panel will consist of the JPC Netball TIC, Co-Manager and 1 other interviewer with a good knowledge of netball coaching.
- All coaches will be notified by the John Paul College Netball TIC within 24 hours of the final Coach interview as to who will be the successful coach.
- The 2016 John Paul College Yr 7, Yr 8, Yr 10, Social & Senior Coach appointments' will also be announced by John Paul College/School Netball Manager/TIC via the Centres'/ schools website 24 hours after the final interview.

2016 John Paul College Yr 7, Yr 8, Yr 10, Social & Senior Coach Selection

- The Yr 7, Yr 8, Yr 10, Social & Senior Coaches will be selected on their previous coaching history with Rotorua Netball and John Paul College past experiences. Each coach will be chosen on performance, attitude and coach development qualifications.
- Coaches currently coaching teams registered with John Paul College will be eligible and considered if there is no other coach at John Paul College that is of a higher ability. The Panel will make the final decision.
- If a Coach withdraws from a representative age group coaching position, the assistant coach or next qualified coach should be approached to replace them as soon as possible. If no one is suitable or available, the position will be advertised.

Selection Policies and Procedures

1. INTRODUCTION

This Policy applies to the John Paul College 2016 Netball Player Selection and replaces all previous selection policies and procedures for these teams.

2. TEAM MANAGEMENT

School Sports Coordinator and School Netball Teacher in Charge will appoint management for the teams, including Coaches following the Coach Selection Policy

3. SELECTION PANEL

- 3.1 The Selection Panel wherever possible, will include the coaches and at least two other appointed selectors with sound netball coaching background. (Usually one representative from the school and one external representative)
- 3.2 The Selection Panel may meet to discuss issues of selection and may seek the views of others on certain players but any final selection rests solely with the Selection Panel.
- 3.3 Any member of the Selection Panel, who has an association with any player that could give rise to a question of bias or conflict of interest in the selection process, will defer from selection discussions on that particular player (i.e. parent as coach)

The Final selections will usually be made based on the views of the majority of the Selection Panel, however where there is no clear majority, the Coach of that team will make the final decision.

All documentation used by the Selection Panel will be retained by the Coach & TIC of Netball till the end of the Netball season

4. SELECTION OBJECTIVES

- 4.1 The Primary objective of John Paul College is to select teams from the players attending John Paul College trials on the set dates. Players are preferred to have attended at least 3 of the trials however in some circumstances (discussed with selectors prior to trials) previous performances will be considered in the selection process.
- 4.2 **UNISS:** Selection does not guarantee a position. Trials will be based on students' performance and skill.
- 4.3 **The Selection Policy is that:**

The Teams selected shall usually comprise of up to 10 -12 players.

(a) The players will be of the school year that they are trialling for but the selection panel reserves the right to select a player from a lower year if it is deemed by the selectors that there is no one in the older year group of similar or higher ability

(b) Players can be removed from the Team's at any time if they have displayed inappropriate behaviour or conduct or an unsatisfactory attitude, lack of commitment, non-compliance or non-attendance with training requirements.

(c) Players need to have returned all uniforms and cleared any outstanding debts to the school before participating in trials. Costs and dates involved with the Netball season will be advertised 4-6 weeks in advance via John Paul College Website / Newsletter and Permission Slips.

All Players trialling for John Paul College Netball 2016 are to have an automatic payment set up before trials start. There will be a Non Refundable 50% fee to be paid if a player chooses not to play after 3 weeks of registration.

When selecting players for each team, the Selection Panel shall apply the criteria and considerations set out below.

Core Playing Competencies:

- Sound skill base and developing consistency of performance on court.
- Displays developing tactical awareness and understanding and is establishing some consistency in making appropriate decisions in demanding situations.
- Shows ability to use flair and innovation in their game.
- Is committed to achieving and maintaining fitness required for this level of competition.
- Ability to sustain intensity in performance throughout game.
- Shows the potential skills and capabilities to represent John Paul College at the highest level.

Core Personal Qualities:

- Demonstrates team qualities and a readiness to listen, learn and apply learning.
- Strong work ethic.
- Shows discipline on and off the court.
- Shows developing ability to withstand pressure on and off the court.
- Versatility, consistency and adaptability.
- Ability to serve as a role model for others.
- Dedicated and committed to developing the competencies required.

Consideration will also be given to the following factors:

- Fit within the team environment.
- State of fitness, health and well-being.
- Positional balance within team.
- Succession planning.
- Previous & current form or performance of incumbent team members.
- Balance of experience and youth.
- Whether a player's performance and/or contribution has been affected by extenuating circumstances such as illness, injury, bereavement, study commitments or similar which have temporarily compromised their form and/or recent contribution.
- Such other factors as the selectors consider in their opinion and in their complete discretion, to be relevant and appropriate.

- 4.4** Providing the Selection Panel has considered the above criteria and exercised their discretion and judgement, in good faith, and then the Selection Panel will have fulfilled all of its obligations under this Policy.
- 4.5** The Selection Panel will observe players at a minimum of two trials to ensure players are given adequate opportunities to be viewed prior to final selections for the Teams. All trialists will be viewed at least twice on the court and in their two preferred playing positions. Dates for trials will be set early, giving players 2 – 4 weeks' notice.

5. POST - SELECTION REQUIREMENTS

Following the selection of the Teams

The Team will be announced by the Head Coach

- Unsuccessful players may apply in writing to the school Netball TIC within 5 days of the naming of the team for specific feedback
- Players will fully comply with training requirements as set out by the Team Coach.
- Players will abide by the Team Code of Conduct. (to be developed by the Team)
- Players will adhere to all schools rules & policies including the Players Code of Behaviour.

6. SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES

In case of injuries the committee will go back to the selection sheets and bring in the next player that is suited to the position on court. That player should of trialled for the Team to be eligible to play in the Team but if due to injury or other circumstances, another player can be bought in to replace a player.
