



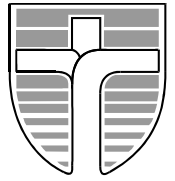

NEWS FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Board of Trustees (BOT) met again on 29 March.

We received a presentation from DP Ali McHugh on student pastoral care – an essential part of the daily life of the school. Care Plans have been prepared for each year level based on specific needs of each age group, but all with the intent of providing students with the skills and strategies to become resilient young adults. The Plans also reflect the importance of using restorative practices when appropriate.

The Board also received a presentation from the Arts Faculty in relation to the proposed Performing Arts Centre – in the lead up to decisions that need to be made very soon on the final design.

Other matters discussed and decisions made included:

- Discussion on a policy relating to police vetting of volunteers in the school – which will be the topic of a separate communication;
- A decision to no longer offer Cambridge exams at Year 12, effective from 2017
- Confirmation that Carmel Veitch will fill the vacant Proprietor's Representative vacancy on the Board.
- Receipt of a draft of the Principal's 2015 Performance Review and his Performance Objectives for 2016.

The Board has one more meeting before the Trustee elections. IF you are interested in making yourself available for nomination, all important dates relating to the election process will be included in future newsletters.

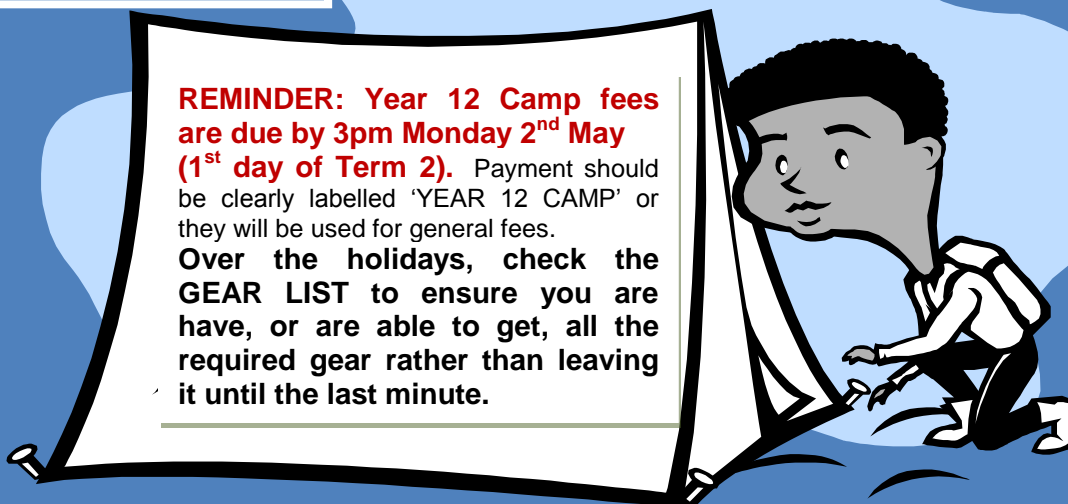

Kia ora tātou from the Counsellors

While much of what we do in counselling is in response to problems brought to us, we aim also to be proactive in helping students to develop both the skills for dealing with challenges and the **resilience** to side step bumps in the road as they journey onward in life.

Resilience - What exactly is it and why is it so important? Here are 2 definitions:

Resilience can be understood as the capacity to spring back, rebound and successfully adapt in the face of adversity (Henderson et al, 1999).

In a New Zealand context, resiliency could be considered as hauora – a state of strength and well-being. It gives individuals living in an adverse environment the capacity to surmount their difficulties (Peters and Thurlow, 2002)

Considering the daily challenges that lie ahead for our young people, helping them to develop resilience will be very important in supporting them to enjoy fulfilling lives of emotional and social well-being.

To this end, JPC runs the Year 9 **Travellers** programme each year. Travellers, is a school-based programme for young people in their first year of secondary school that helps them face life's challenges with confidence and new skills. Its aim is to help students build resilience and develop self-confidence. From an on-line survey, a group of 8-10 students will be invited to participate in a 10 week course of learning led by the two school counsellors. We are currently working through the on-line surveys with our year 9 classes. The permission of parents/caregivers will be sought prior to the start of the course.

Findings from the Travellers pilot project:

Young people report:

- *that their experience in Travellers enhanced their connections with peers, family members, staff and facilitators*
- *reduced emotional distress*
- *improved school performance*

The adjudicator was Dr Mark Houlahan, Senior Lecturer in English at the University of Waikato and current President of the Australian and New Zealand Shakespeare Association.

John Paul College did exceedingly well winning both the 15 minute Teacher Directed scene from *A Midsummer Night's Dream* and the 5 minute Student Directed *The Comedy of Errors* directed by **Lucy Pepper**.
