Dear Parents/ Caregivers Kia Ora, Malo e Lelei, Talofa, Greetings TERM 2 CRITICAL FOR SENIORS

I will be impressing upon the senior school (Years 11-13) that Term 2, is a critical time to focus on assessments, attending all classes and ploughing through the syllabus.

Please support the college by:

- Ensuring that they do a minimum of 2-3 hours of school work per night and 4-5 hours in the weekend;
- Check they are not too distracted from school work by part-time employment, their social life or technology pastimes;
- Checking their assessment schedule;
- Liaising with their teachers if you have any concerns.

At this stage of the year, students in the senior school are receiving feedback on how many credits they have achieved and at what level. This will let them know if they are on target to achieve level 1, 2 or 3.

Please ask your children to share this information with you. They can also access the NZQA website to check on their progress. If you have any concerns contact their teachers. Senior exams commence Monday May 25th

SENIOR ASSESSMENT WEEK: 30th MAY – 3rd JUNE

During Senior Assessment Week, exams will take place within the normal timetabled classes. No extracurricular activities will be timetabled and it is the expectation that all students will be in attendance. These exams will give students the real benefits of experiencing exam conditions. It helps them refocus on what they have learned, gain qualitative feedback from teachers and in many cases, gain valuable credits and complete assignments.

Please encourage your children to take them seriously, given the benefits and the fact they are compulsory.

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Kia ora tātou from the Counsellors

As the new term gets underway, it is timely to revisit one of our key focus areas this year – cyber-safety. Earlier in term one we set up an email address specifically for students and parents of the school to forward any on-line messaging which is bullying or objectionable in nature: <u>itsnotok@jpc.school.nz</u>_Our aim in creating this address was to actively discourage on-line bullying and to keep our students cyber-safe. Since launching this site we have noticed a marked reduction in the incidence of cyber-bullying incidents, which is really pleasing.

When cyber (and other) bullying has taken place, it has been apparent that there is a common theme; children are singled out for being different in some way. Kids can be very quick to pick up on differences in others' appearance, behaviour, abilities, ethnicity, gender identity and so on, and can target these differences as an opportunity for harassment. A big part of this is tied in with the importance that kids often attach to "fitting in" with their peers. For many kids there is security to be had within conformity and sameness. The flip side of this coin is the harm caused to individuals who are harassed for standing out in some way. Even for those who are not bullied, fear of being judged can be silencing and lead to anxiety. The 24/7 nature of social media has heightened this worry for many young people. In helping our children and young people to develop resilience and values of tolerance and respect for both self and others, we can challenge their conformist thinking and communicate the message that difference is good, that it's OK to voice an alternative point of view and that everyone deserves to be respected for who they are.

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LIONS SPEECHMAKERS CONTEST 2016

District Finals will be held throughout New Zealand on a weekend late May - end June 2016 to determine the winners per district.

These winners will travel to the National Finals in Wellington on Saturday 13th August 2016. All travel to the Finals is at the expense of New Zealand Lions Clubs. The National Finalist will be required to deliver the two speeches as aforementioned.

An overall National winner will be determined at this contest and their prize will be a four to six week trip to the United States/Canada. Air travel, accommodation and meals will be met by Lions Clubs International and our sponsor.

'APPLE A DAY' STORY

We know that having a sick child can be pretty stressful, and sometimes downright scary! On average children aged between 6 months and 5 years will get about 6-10 viral illnesses a year. That means, for the children registered with us here at Ranolf St about 8,000 infections a year!

The good news is the vast majority of these infections are minor and children usually come right in about a week. They don't need treatment with antibiotics (which have no effect on viruses), and are rarely so severe that they need hospital treatment.

These infections are more common in the winter months, if your child has older brothers and sisters (bringing home infections from school), or if your child goes to kindy or kohanga reo.

So, what can you do?

- Keep your child away from daycare if they are sick.
- Teach your children good cough hygiene (use tissues, cough into their elbow)

• Teach good hand washing – they should be washing for as long as it takes to sing Happy Birthday to themselves

Here are two useful resources. The first one "*When should I worry*" is a great little leaflet from the NHS. Download it, read it and use if you come to the surgery. <u>http://www.whenshouldlworry.com</u> (Remember though that this is an NHS leaflet. Emergency numbers in New Zealand are 111 not 999)

The other, from the Royal Children's Hospital in Melbourne, is a useful explanation of viral illnesses. <u>http://www.rch.org.au/kidsinfo/fact_sheets/Viral_illnesses/</u>

The Genesis Energy Hillary Challenge is undoubtedly the toughest adventure competition for high school students and the battle for first is intense because it is a prestigious and highly coveted title for schools to achieve. Participants qualify for the final by meeting the required criteria during the Hillary Challenge 6 hour Adventure Race events the year before.
