



The Genesis Energy

FINAL 2016



The Genesis Energy Hillary Challenge is undoubtedly the toughest adventure competition for high school students and the battle for first is intense because it is a prestigious and highly coveted title for schools to achieve. Not only does this event require a high level of physical and mental fitness, being a team sport, members need the ability to work together under stress.

Participants qualify for the final by meeting the required criteria during the Hillary Challenge 6 hour Adventure Race events the year before.

The 16th annual challenge to find the top Secondary School Outdoor Adventure Team in New Zealand and Australia took place 8-13 May 2016.

The 5 day Hillary Challenge is held each year at Hillary Outdoors Tongariro, and is only open to a total of **12 teams**, each consisting of 8 students (4 males, 4 females.) from Year 12 or 13. The teams will be scored on their skill, speed and endurance during a 5-day series of outdoor adventure challenges, including a 2-day rogaine style wilderness expedition and a multisport race on the final day. In true adventure racing tradition, the exact details of all challenges will be kept secret until the event.

The first 2 days of competition, consisted of 12 challenges, JPC won the abseiling challenge and banked maximum points, and this gave the team a ranking of 9^{th} . Next 2 days was a major Rogaine, requiring the team to find 109 check points which they had to verify by GPS. The team had to be no more than 50m apart, they had to be at a campsite by 5pm, they could not depart from camp until 7am next morning. Each check point had a value, which could be hit and miss if you navigating skills aren't spot on, we finish 11^{th} for this challenge. The weather forecast was for high winds gusting to 100km, rain between 30-40 millimetres, throw in low cloud and you have tough conditions for a Rogaine, which made finding check points even more difficult. The team has to carry packs for the whole entire time. Penalties are dished out if you don't follow the rules.

(**Rogaine** is the sport of long distance cross-country navigation in which teams visit as many checkpoints as possible. Teams travel entirely on foot, navigating by map and compass between checkpoints in terrain that varies.)

The last day (rained all day) was a Multisport Day; 10km of running, 6km floatation challenge, 7km of more running, then mountain biking for 30km. Top teams can complete the course in 4.5 hours up to 6.5 hours for the rest. Unfortunately JPC had a team member injured within the first km of the 10km run, so had to drop them out after the floatation challenge. This cost the team 200 bonus points and a 15% penalty deduction on points gained. This took our possible ranking of 7th overall for the week to 9th overall. Prize giving was on the Friday night. It was quiet moving to see all the teams in their schools number ones (uniforms). JPC did win a major prize on the night, the team **Synergy Award** (the real effect resulting from different individuals working together and their cooperation.) This is chosen by all the Hillary instructors that observe all the teams at the different challenges, and the way the team members look after each other. Synergy Award Prize: A weekend for 10 students at Hillary Outdoor Education with an instructor.

If you are keen to compete in adventure racing for JPC see Mr Faulkner. Upcoming events: Get2Go (Year 9 &10) Hillary 6hr Challenge (Year 11 – 13.) Must be able to do; Cross Country, Mountain Biking, and Rock Climbing and must love the tough stuff. (When the going gets tough, the tough keep going - meaning when the situation becomes difficult, the strong will work harder to meet the challenge.)

WHEN SHOULD YOU WORRY

We know that having a sick child can be pretty stressful, and sometimes downright scary! On average children aged between 6 months and 5 years will get about 6-10 viral illnesses a year. That means, for the children registered with us here at Ranolf St about 8,000 infections a year!

The good news is the vast majority of these infections are minor and children usually come right in about a week. They don't need treatment with antibiotics (which have no effect on viruses), and are rarely so severe that they need hospital treatment.

These infections are more common in the winter months, if your child has older brothers and sisters (bringing home infections from school), or if your child goes to kindy or kohanga reo.

So, what can you do?

- Keep your child away from daycare if they are sick.
- Teach your children good cough hygiene (use tissues, cough into their elbow)
- Teach good hand washing they should be washing for as long as it takes to sing Happy Birthday to themselves
