
We are now accepting enrolments for the 2017 intake.



Matariki, the Maori New Year, has commenced

What is Matariki?

Matariki is the Maori name for a group of seven stars known as the Pleiades star cluster. Some people think of Matariki as a mother star with six daughters, and it is often referred to as the Seven Sisters. Matariki appears in the eastern sky sometime around the shortest day of the year, and is thought to determine how successful the harvest crop will be in the coming season. The brighter the stars, the more productive the crop will be.

What does Matariki mean?

Matariki has two meanings, both of which refer to the cluster of stars. Mata Riki means Tiny Eyes, and Mata Ariki means Eyes of God.

When is Matariki celebrated?

Matariki begins to rise in the last few days of May, and this symbolises the coming of the Maori New Year. Some iwi (tribes) start celebrations when Matariki is first seen, however it is the first new moon after Matariki that officially signals the Maori New Year. Some people celebrate the New Year on the day the new moon rises, and others celebrate on the day after the new moon. Celebrations can last up to 3 days.

Why is Matariki important?

In years gone by, Matariki was thought to determine your crop for the coming season, and therefore it was important to recognise the part it played in nature's cycle. The disappearance of Matariki in Autumn, signaled the time to gather and preserve crops, and so was an important marker in the harvest calender.

Nowadays, Matariki is seen as an important time to celebrate the earth, and show respect for the land on which we live.

How is Matariki celebrated?

Traditionally Matariki was celebrated by gathering with whanau (family) and reflecting on the past. The festival's connection to the stars provided an opportunity for families to remember their whakapapa (genealogy) and those ancestors who had passed away to the heavens. Offerings were made to land-based gods who would help provide good crops, and new trees were planted to signal new beginnings.

Many of these traditional celebrations are still practiced today, however there are many others ways that Matariki is celebrated also. Most celebrations focus around music, song, dance, food and family.

UC EMERGING LEADERS' SCHOLARSHIPS* - CLOSE 15 August 2016

Head Boy or Head Girl Awards

For 2017, the University of Canterbury is offering up to 30 Emerging Leaders' Scholarships to the Head Boy or Head Girl of any New Zealand secondary school. Selection criteria include academic achievement (at least NCEA Level 2 at Merit level (or equivalent), leadership potential and involvement in sport, cultural and/or community activities.

Other categories for UC Emerging Leaders' Scholarships include All-Round Excellence Award, Maori Leadership Awards, Pasifika Leadership Awards, and Awards for students who demonstrate outstanding sporting achievement.

Students apply for the scholarship through the UC Scholarships website. Applications can be submitted online from the 20th June 2016. The closing date is 15th August 2015. To submit a scholarship application on line, students need to first register for a myUC account through which to log-in to the site. Students Referees will also be invited to submit references through the online system.

We suggest students request references early on in the application period.

UC INTERNATIONAL FIRST YEAR SCHOLARSHIPS - CLOSE 15TH AUGUST

These scholarships recognise top achieving international students who will gain University Entrance from a New Zealand secondary school in the year of application. Selection criteria include academic achievement, leadership potential, involvement in sport, cultural/or community activities, and international experience. The current value of the scholarships is up to NZ\$20,000 towards payment of first year tuition fees.

Application Guidelines for First Year Scholarships

Eligibility criteria

Students must always check eligibility restrictions, such as gender, age, nationality, indigenous or other special group and only apply if you match the eligibility criteria. If you intend to take a gap year in 2017, note that most scholarships that allow a gap year require you to make an application in your final year of high school.

Referees

Students referees are very important always make sure they know which scholarships you are applying for. Ensure they know the appropriate information about you that the selection committee will need to know. Referees will submit their references through the online system.

Personal Statements

Your personal statements are very important; it is your opportunity to 'talk' to the selection committee and it is their opportunity to find out what you have to say about yourself. Your statement can reflect your views and aspirations, can explain the events and people that have been major influences on your life, can describe what drives you, why you have chosen the path you have and what your plans are for the future. One paragraph statements are not ideal.

OBOP Rogaines - 19 June, 3 July, 17 July 2016

OBOP is running a series of 3 short rogaines over June and July in and around Rotorua.

- 19 June Redwoods, Whaka Forest Have a Go at O Day Longmile Road, signposted from Tarawera Road.
- 3 July Ngahiwa signposted from SH5, 20km south of Rotorua.
- 17 July Tui Ridge signposted from SH36 between Hamurana and Ngongotaha.

We will send out further reminders closer to each event.

Each rogaine will be 60 minutes where people try to visit as many controls as they can in the time allowed. Registration will open at 10am, maps will be handed out at 10.45am, and the event will start at 11am.

The events can be done individually or in pairs, or you can have a team of 3 or 4 if you prefer.

The events will be suitable for all ages and abilities, including families. You can go as easy or as hard as you like. We will also be running navigation training before the events (see below) if you want to improve your skills, and/or prepare for the Great Forest Rogaine and other upcoming adventure races.

Great Forest Rogaine - Rotorua - 30 July 2016

in Whakarewarewa Forest.

All you need to do is get together a team of family or friends who are keen for a great adventure in the forest. A rogaine involves trying to visit as many checkpoints as you can in the time allowed - so it's not only the physical side, but also the mental challenges of navigation and route choice. In the end though, you decide how easy or hard you want to go!



Teams can do the event on Mountain Bike or on Foot for either 3 or 6 hours.

Max Kerrison is setting separate courses for each discipline to maximise the **fun** for each. 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
