

2016 ROTORUA SPEECH COMPETITIONS


Congratulations to all of the competitors in the 70th Anniversary Rotorua Competitions held during the holidays.

JPC 1ST XI FOOTBALL – NATIONAL CHAMPS QUALIFICATION UPDATE

JPC 3 vs St Pauls Collegiate 0

In a must win game the 1st XI played a rare lunch time game at school and thrived on the support of the large home crowd. With Jacob Kitson and Caleb Marriner marshalling a very strong defence JPC withstood the early pressure from St Paul's and then looked to dominant the game with hard work up front from Ryan Heath leading to Nathan Monne scoring from a free kick to make the score 1-0 at half time. A dominant second half team performance was capped with two fine goals from the team's outstanding mid fielder Steffano Riley. This was a significant win over one of Waikato/Bay of Plenty's traditional top four footballing schools.

JPC 1 vs St John's College 2

The final game of the qualification series was against St John's and a draw would have been enough to see JPC through to Premiers. Despite a Nathan Monne goal giving JPC the perfect start it was not to be their day with St John's scoring the vital equaliser seconds before half time. In a second half that could have gone either way St John's made the most of their opportunities to snatch a goal for a well-deserved 1-2 win. The loss left JPC one single point outside of the top four and meant they will be not be going to Premier Nationals in 2016. They have instead qualified for Division 2 Nationals Champs.

The team will now regroup and plan for the NZ Secondary Schools Division 2 National Tournament to be held in Taupo during winter tournament week. Team Management would like to take this opportunity to thank Mr Bloomfield and the school for supporting the 1st XI in this campaign and also the support of the team sponsors Rotorua MacDonald's. Thanks also to the parents and families for their support, transport and time.


