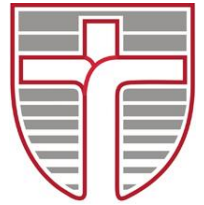

ACADEMIC AUDIT: YEARS 11-13

4. Not handing in assignments or seeking reassessment opportunities

SCHOOL FEES & ATTENDANCE DUES

It is important to note that there are two distinct charges to parents whose children attend John Paul College. Attendance dues are charged by the Hamilton Diocese, largely for buildings, while school fees contribute to resources and running costs of the school.

The Hamilton Diocese have spent well over \$10million on buildings for JPC over the last decade, including the new technology block, costing \$3.3million, which has been greatly appreciated by staff and students.

SCIENCE FAIR EXHIBITION – OPEN EVENING

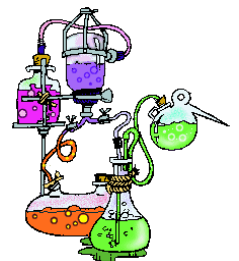

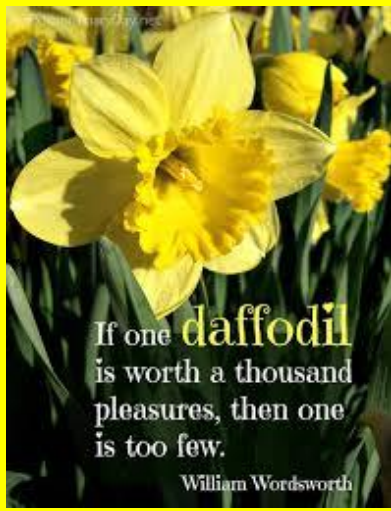

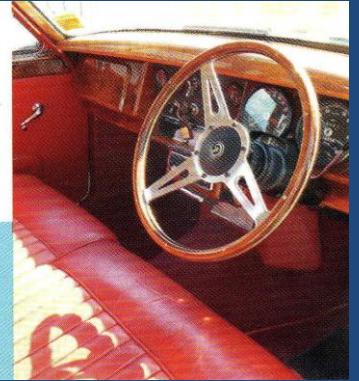
