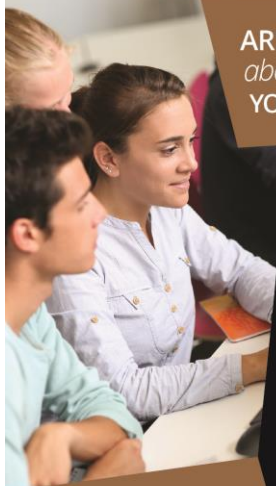

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SWIMMING NEWS

NZ Team - Bianca Donelley (14yrs) competed as part of the New Zealand Age Group Swimming Team at the Australian State Championships in Canberra September 23-25th. Bianca raced exceptionally well, achieving the magic 100% personal best from all entered events and provisionally broke the 100 Free Bay of Plenty Record that has stood for over 10 years. She had Top 10 placings in all entered events, and placed 4th in the 100 and 200 Freestyle.

NZ Short Course Champs - David Boles, Bianca Donelley, and Milla Theobald all completed as part of a Swim Rotorua team at the Elite New Zealand Short Course Swimming Championships in Auckland last week.

- Bianca won 8 national Medals and is the holder of the 14year old National Title in 100 freestyle. As well as that GOLD, she won SILVER in 200 free, 100 back, and 50 free, and BRONZE in 400 free, 800 free, 50 back and 200 Back. Her times were so fast that she made open age finals in eight events even though she is only fourteen.

- Milla Theobald (13yrs) was competing for the first time at this competition and had an outstanding week winning two national medals, both BRONZE, in the 400m and 800m freestyle. She placed in the top ten in 5 other events and achieved an Open Age Final in 200 fly.

- David (16yrs) achieved six top 10 Age Group placings from his nine events. He placed 4th in the 1500m freestyle improving his time by over 5 seconds. He also made the Open Age final in 200 backstroke.

Luisa Vulu also competed at the Championships placing 22nd in the 16 yr girls 50 Backstroke. This was the first time she had qualified for a top level national age group competition.
