MCDONALD'S SPELLING BEE ROTORUA 2016



GUS DUBE YEAR 12 SELECTED FOR UK SHAKESPEARE TOUR 2017

Gus Dube Year 12 and Head Boy-Elect for 2017 has been selected from over 6000 student actors from throughout New Zealand to join the National Shakespeare Team to tour the UK in 2017. A key feature of the tour is the opportunity to visit Stratford-on-Avon and to study and perform on the stage at the famous Globe Theatre in London.



Gus Dube performed in the highly praised John Paul College entry at the National Festival of the Shakespeare Globe Centre New Zealand (SGCNZ) *University of Otago-Sheilah Winn Festival of Shakespeare in Secondary Schools* held in the Michael Fowler Centre and St. James theatre in Wellington at Queen's Birthday weekend. At regional festivals preceding this event in Wellington over 270 secondary schools and over 6,000 student actors engage with Shakespeare's plays by performing 5-minute and 15-minute excerpts from Shakespeare's plays with other secondary schools in their region. From the regional festivals a small group of student actors are selected to perform at the national festival held in Wellington.

From his showcase performance in Wellington at Queen's Birthday weekend Gus Dube was selected as one of 48 outstanding young actors to attend the prestigious Shakespeare Globe Centre New Zealand 2017 National Shakespeare Schools Production (NSSP) held in Dunedin during the Term 3 holidays. From this event the small national team to tour the UK is selected.


