#### JPC CLAYTARGET TEAM BRING HOME THE SOUTH ISLAND COMPETITION TROPHY

End of Term 3 had the claytarget team at the Secondary School National in Christchurch. JPC Clay target Team, Bayley Austin, Liam Shorland, Dillon Tillemans, Luke Veltman and Dylan Austin shot their way up the ladder to win the South Island Trophy with a score of 292/300.

Bayley Austin placed 1st in single rise with a score of 20/20 after a shoot off of 184 targets, as well as 1<sup>st</sup> in the Fish and game event. He also shot 10/10 Single Barrel and after a shoot off, placed 8th out of 315 shooters. Bayley also made the Eastern BOP regionals Team and shot all 50/50 points. After a shoot off he received High Overall (HOA) for the regionals' individuals. The BOP team shot their way to 3<sup>rd</sup> place.

Liam Shorland placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in the point score; shot 60/60 after a long shot off. Liam also shot 10/10 in single barrel and after the shoot off, took 9th place out of 315 shooters Liam also received his 50 Badge.

Dylan Austin Shot 89/90 for the whole day and place 3<sup>rd</sup> after the shoot off ended in the dark! Dylan also shot 60/60 in the points score ending in 4th place after the shoot off. StudyLink expects around 180,000 students to apply for their Student Allowance or Loan for the 2017 academic year.

Applying by 16 December means StudyLink can get everything sorted so that the student receives their funding from the start of their course.

Students don't need to have their NCEA results or have locked down all their plans in order to apply.

Their application can be updated as things are confirmed. It's more important to allow enough time for all the steps in the application process to be completed.




