Loren intends further study in the MD/PhD programme at either New York or Griffith University both of whom she has received conditional offers from.


She will leave for the UK in September this year.

HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Yr 7-10 Health books are to be purchased from the Uniform Shop (as soon as possible) and not from OfficeMax.

RE: MATHS BUDDY

The Mathematics Teaching Staff of John Paul College have decided to incorporate the online Maths Buddy resource as part of the compulsory teaching program for 2016 for year 7. This is instead of the Mathematics homework book. The website is designed to provide support to students in their Mathematics learning.

The key features of the Maths Buddy website are:

- 1. <u>Virtual Tutor</u>: An on-screen lesson for different mathematical concepts with a pause/rewind/fast forward facility which allows your child to learn and control the lesson at a pace that suits them or to go over a lesson as many times as they wish.
- 2. <u>Homework setting</u>: Teachers will be setting homework through the Maths Buddy website. The homework will be tailored to your child's ability in Mathematics and all marking of work is done immediately
- 3. <u>Progress reports</u>: Parents can receive automatic weekly reports on their child's programme use and mathematical progress.

Before access is given to any student, the following acknowledgement form must be filled out and returned to Mrs Boyce in the accounts office, with a payment of \$25. An individual login will be given to your child giving them access to the entire Maths Buddy program and its improvements until the end of January 2017. For students who do not have computer access at home, there will be an opportunity to access Maths Buddy in the library during break times and during the homework club run by John Paul College on Monday and Wednesday after school. Now that the year is underway it's time to begin regular fortnightly contributions to the school newsletter from the Counselling team. Our hope is that this space will provide helpful information to parents and whanau about some of the work we do at school, as well as providing a link to resources you might find interesting and topical as you parent your children and teens. Each fortnight we will present some aspect of our work as counsellors at JPC and we welcome your feedback. Firstly though, some introductions.

Nancy Macmillan (Ph extn 8854). Some of you may know me from my previous role as an English teacher here at JPC. In 2011 I embarked on study through the University of Waikato towards a Master of Counselling, completing this at the end of 2013. For the past two years I have been Head of Counselling at John Paul College. My new role sees me working closely with students to support them in working through challenges they face in their lives. I welcome your input as parents and whanau in caring for and supporting our students.

Neil Carter (Ph extn 8808). I have an 18 year history as a community and faith based youth worker, running youth groups and teaching life skills programmes in schools. I have spent many years working with young people and their families, helping them deal with the issues life throws at them. In 2014 I completed a Diploma in Counselling from Bethlehem Tertiary Institute. I pride myself on being non-judgmental and easy to talk to. My goal is not to tell students what to think or believe, but to assist them in understanding themselves and supporting them as they journey through life.

Cyber-safety at JPC

As part of our care for the students at JPC, one of our key focus areas this year is cyber-safety. To this end, we will be regularly talking and working with students around keeping themselves safe on-line.

Additionally, we have set up an email address specifically for students and parents of the school to forward any on-line messaging which is bullying or objectionable in nature. My name is Hana Turner and I am a PhD student at the University of Auckland. I am currently undertaking research into the factors which contribute to high student achievement at secondary school from the perspective of successful students and their teachers. One draw will be made in May 2016 and a draw of the remaining gift cards will be made in September 2016. To maintain anonymity, students' contact information will be collected and stored separately from their survey responses. This is achieved by redirecting students to an external link once they reach the end of the questionnaire (if they choose to enter the prize draw). No identifying information about any student, teacher or school will be reported in the study. School names are only collected so that the geographical region of the school and its decile is able to be identified for demographic purposes.
