#### HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION



#### JPC STUDENTS COMPETE AT MINISTOCKS

On Fri 12th and Sat 13th Feb at Rotorua's Paradise Valley Raceway 10 JPC pupils competed in Ministocks in Paradise. (Byron Haigh, Campbell Haigh, Cole Fahy, Sheyenne Williams, Mikayla Wepa, Tyson Rimmer, Anyssa Rimmer, Cody Bryson, Riley Russell and Hadley Russell).

This meeting is highly regarded in the class of Ministocks with 174 competitors from all over New Zealand coming to compete. The drivers are split into 2 classes Juniors 12-14 (33 cars) and Seniors 14-17 (141cars).



On the first night the aim for the Seniors is to qualify for the top 26 to compete for the MIP title. For the juniors they have a championship run over 6 races over the two nights and the winner is the one with the highest points. Five Rotorua cars qualified for the Tubby Norris MIP top group. Congratulations to Byron Haigh who was one of the drivers to qualify in the top group.

# Secondary school students needed for University research study – Anonymous online questionnaire

#### **Student Success:**

#### What matters most for high achieving Māori and non-Māori students at secondary school?

My name is Hana Turner and I am a PhD student at the University of Auckland. I am currently undertaking research into the factors which contribute to high student achievement at secondary school from the perspective of successful students and their teachers. I am looking to recruit 1,200 high achieving Year 12 and Year 13 students to complete an anonymous online questionnaire which will take around 20-30 minutes to complete. The questionnaire asks students for their views about success, effective and ineffective teachers, student-teacher relationships and school engagement.

Attached is an advertisement which contains a link to a Participant Information Sheet (which explains the study in detail), and the online questionnaire. I would greatly appreciate it if you could forward either a copy of this email or the attached advertisement to all of your Year 12 and Year 13 students. <u>If you do not have a student email system</u> but are happy for your students to participate, you are welcome to place copies of the advertisement on your school noticeboards or in your school newsletter.

Students who meet the selection criteria for the study and complete the entire questionnaire will go into a prize draw to win one of ten \$30 gift cards. One draw will be made in May 2016 and a draw of the remaining gift cards will be made in September 2016. To maintain anonymity, students' contact information will be collected and stored separately from their survey responses. This is achieved by redirecting students to an external link once they reach the end of the questionnaire (if they choose to enter the prize draw). No identifying information about any student, teacher or school will be reported in the study. School names are only collected so that the geographical region of the school and its decile is able to be identified for demographic purposes.

Thank you very much for your time and help in making this study possible. Once the study is complete, I will forward a written report containing the research findings to your school.
