







## MUSICIANS NEEDED! (*Opportunity to earn NCEA Level 1 credits*)

Instrumentalists are needed to join the JPC Concert Band and Jazz Band.

Students who are taking instrumental lessons (both privately and in school) in flute, clarinet, trumpet, saxophone (alto, tenor, and baritone) should come along to our Concert Band rehearsals held every Tuesday lunchtime in the Music Department. The Concert Band is a great opportunity for players of all ability and the level of music we play is suitable for junior students all the way through to Year 13. Senior students are encouraged to mentor the younger students at rehearsals.

Students who are taking instrumental lessons (both privately and in school) in trumpet, trombone, saxophone (alto, tenor and baritone.), electric guitar, and bass guitar should seriously consider joining the Jazz Band that rehearses every Monday in the Music Department after school (3.05pm - 4.10pm). This group is suitable for students of intermediate level through to advanced. Junior students are welcome but must have at least 2-3 years playing experience to tackle the music we play in this band.

These bands should be considered as an extension of the learning taking place in instrumental lessons. Students who join these bands find that their music reading and fluency of performance improves dramatically over a term. *In addition, NCEA Level 1 credits could be gained from membership of both these bands through 'Group Performance'.*


