BOARD TALK- NEWS FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The BoT had its first scheduled meeting of the year on the 27th February. Lyall Thurston was re**elected** unopposed as the Chairperson – a testament to his passion, dedication, experience and professional leadership.

Despite our compelling arguments, we have again been unsuccessful with our latest application to the Ministry of Education for a roll increase to 1200. This is the third time we have been declined and means the roll is capped at 1100 and we have been forced to operate a waiting list. The Board is committed to convincing the Ministry there are unique circumstances at JPC which should permit a roll increase without any detrimental effect on the existing Rotorua school network and will continue lobbying for this.

Local architectural company – Carling Architects have been appointed to prepare the design for the new Performing Arts Centre on the McKillop campus. We anticipate that detailed drawings will be ready for sign off by the Diocese and the Board within the next two or three months, so that final costings can be prepared and a resource consent lodged with the Rotorua Lakes Council. All going well the project should commence early in 2018.

The Board received a full analysis of the 2016 NCEA results. These results were extremely pleasing with almost a 100% pass rate at all levels and an increase in the number of Merit and Excellence endorsements. Of particular note is the excellent achievement of Maori and Pacific students. All these results are similar to those achieved in Decile 9 and 10 schools.

The Board is conscious that there is a huge call on parents and caregivers to support a number of worthy causes during the year. With this in mind the Board has developed a Calendar of Fund Raising for social justice. La Sallian and Catholic character events/causes so that you are aware when a small donation is required or when events will be held. These events will be in the newsletter as they come due.


